Choice Scholarship Program Sibling Track

2019-2020 School Year

Student must satisfy all criteria to qualify for the Choice Scholarship Program under the Sibling Track.

- 1. A student must:
 - a. Have legal settlement in Indiana;
 - b. Be between the ages of 5 and 22 by August 1st; AND

2. A student must:

Have a sibling who received either a Choice Scholarship or an SGO Scholarship in a preceding school
year, including a school year that does not immediately precede the school year for which the student
is applying for a Choice Scholarship;

AND

3. A student must be a member of a household with an annual income equal to or below 150% of the amount to qualify for the Federal Free or Reduced Price Lunch Program. (IC 20-51-1-4.3)

For a household size of eleven (11) or more, add \$8,177 to the annual limit for each additional member for a 90% scholarship and add \$12,266 to the annual limit for each additional member for a 50% scholarship.

90% and 50% Choice Scholarship award amounts are, in part, based on per-student State funding for students' school corporations of residence. The 2019-2020 estimated award amounts are posted on the website at www.doe.in.gov/choice in the section for Parents/Guardians.
